Conference centering upon the mutual relationship between Japanese modern history and the evolution of Japanese architecture. Nakatani makes a brief overview of Japan's evolution beginning with the birth of the modern state (16th Century), industrial revolution (19<sup>th</sup> Century), the modernism (20<sup>th</sup> Century) until the economic growth after WWII as reflected within architecture: from "Tenshu-Kaku" (the westernized top of shogun's palace), to the Pseudo Western Style of industrial architecture, from the Min-Gei movement (the folk craft movement) and Sutemi Horiguchi's architecture to Metabolism and Kenzo Tange's architecture.
